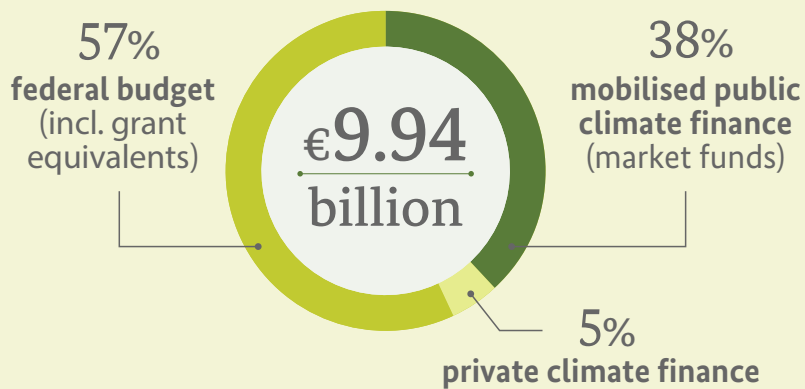
# Overview of German international climate finance 2023

## International climate finance 2023 (total contribution)



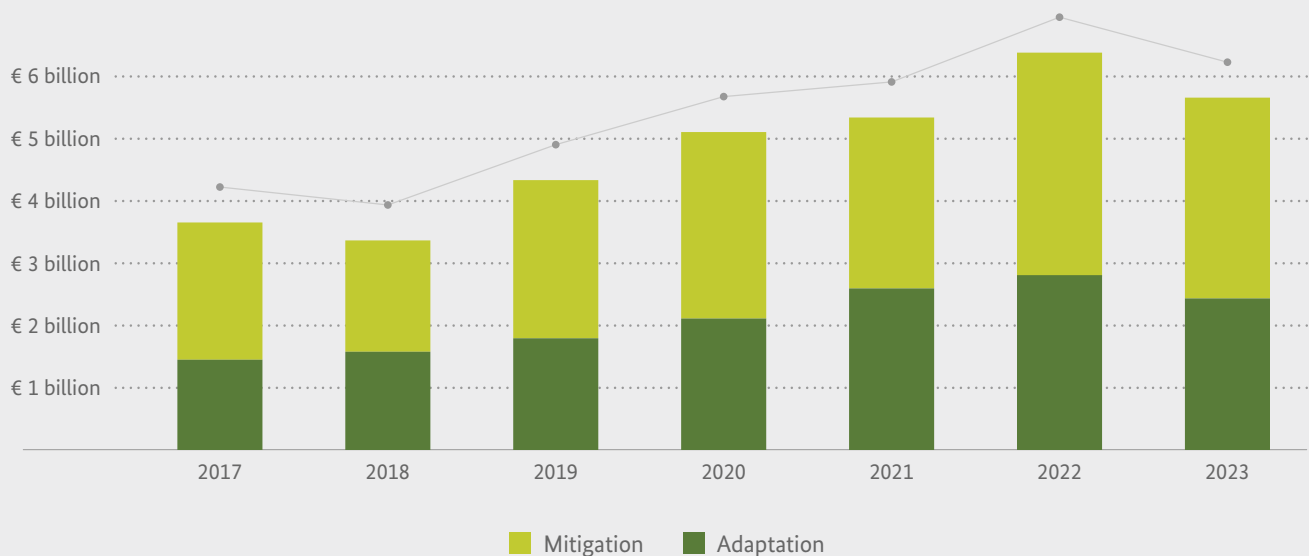
Climate finance total from public funds and from funds mobilised through public and private finance, e.g. in the form of revolving credit lines for local (development) banks, investment in structured funds and public-private partnerships. This represents **Germany's total contribution to international climate finance** and thus to the goal set by industrialised countries of providing \$100 billion a year for climate protection and adaptation measures in developing countries.

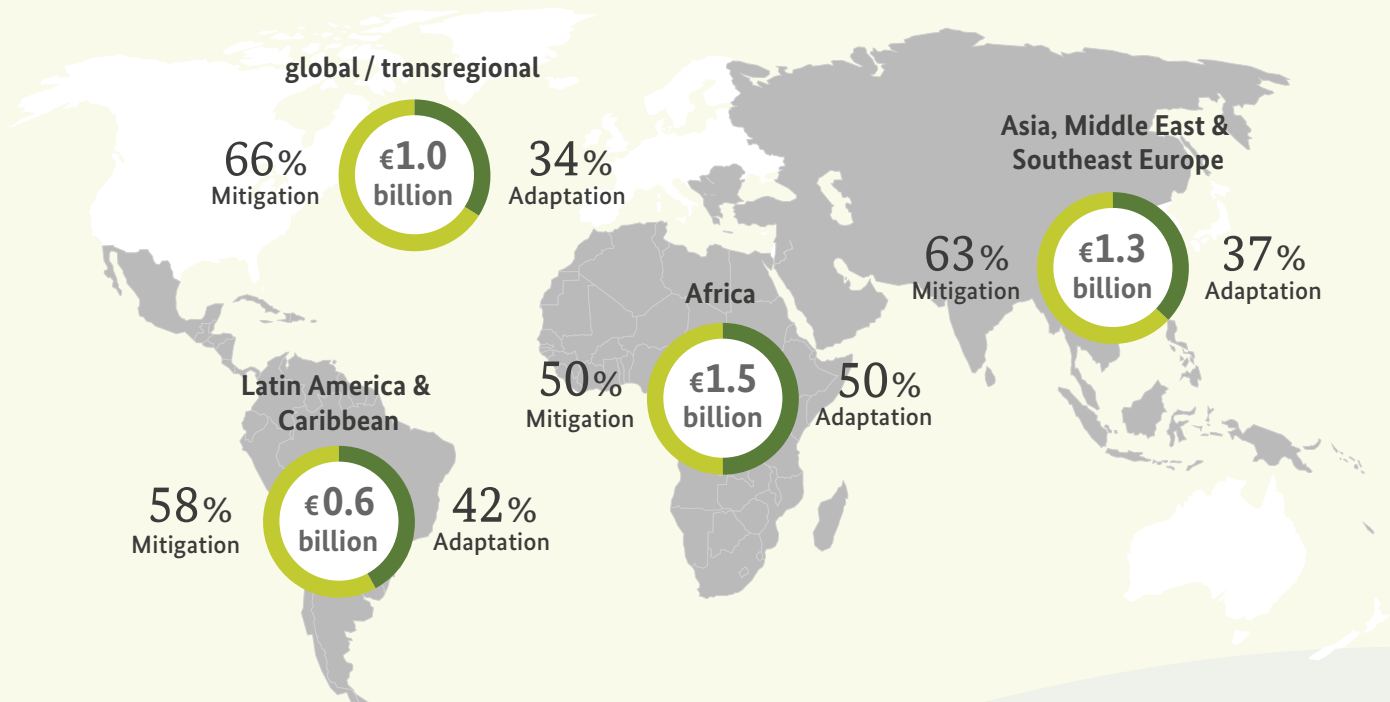

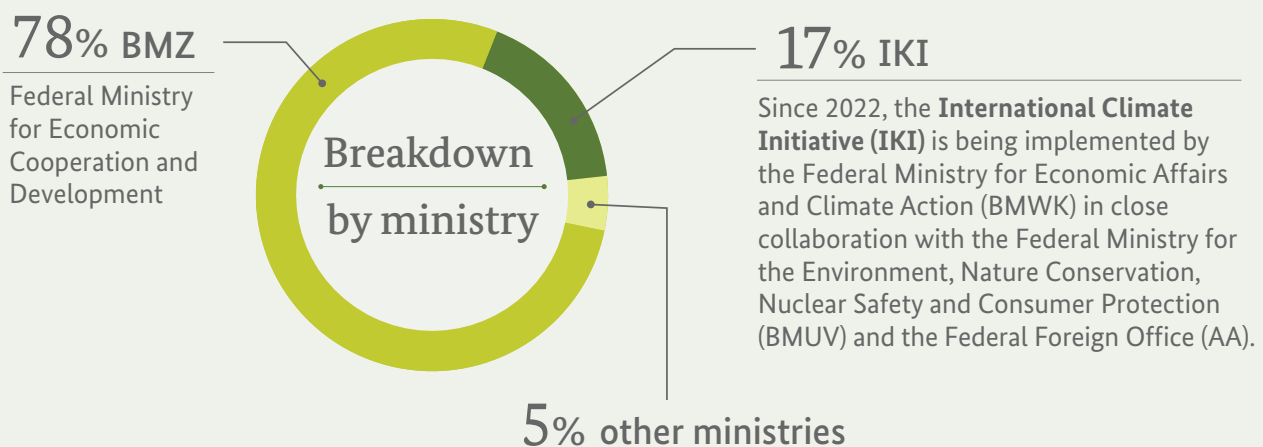

## Bilateral climate finance 2023 by region (federal budget)



Germany channels most of its climate finance through bilateral cooperation. In 2023, around 77 per cent (4.46 billion euros) of the budget allocated to climate finance went towards bilateral cooperation; the remaining 23 per cent (1.20 billion euros) went towards the German government's multilateral activities.
