# Local Initiatives in TAKAMUL III: Concept & Purpose

## Local Initiatives (LIs) under TAKAMUL III

Small-scale, community-driven interventions inside Syria, implemented by local NGOs.

### Main Aim:

- Strengthen **social cohesion**
- Promote **inclusive participation**
- Empower **marginalized groups**, especially **women, youth and people with disabilities**

### How They Contribute:

- Foster **engagement** and non-violent communication
- Build **cooperation** across different community groups
- Rebuild **trust** and strengthen social ties
- Enhance **social and economic** resilience

### Overarching Goal:

Reinforce **social cohesion at the community level**

# Primary Target Groups

**One main group per initiative:  
Women or Youth (18–27)**

**Persons with Disabilities (PwDs):  
Must be included whenever relevant and feasible across all initiatives**

# Objectives of Local Initiatives

Local Initiatives aim to deliver participatory and conflict-sensitive actions that:

1. **Strengthen social cohesion & inclusion** across diverse community groups
2. **Empower marginalized groups** (women, youth & PwDs) to engage in community life
3. **Enhance youth leadership** and youth-led community participation
4. **Promote community ownership** in local development processes
5. **Build NGO capacity** for innovative, scalable & sustainable programming
6. **Facilitate dialogue & cooperation** between communities and local authorities
7. **Link social cohesion with economic participation** to reinforce resilience

# Proposed Local Initiatives - Youth Focus

## Youth Empowerment & Youth-Led Initiatives:

*(not limited to the following examples)*

- Youth-led **dialogue and engagement** with diverse groups (including PwDs)
- **Local economic empowerment** initiatives driven by youth priorities
- **Capacity-building workshops:** leadership, mobilization, conflict sensitivity & advocacy
- Training youth as **community multipliers & local leaders**
- Creating **safe, accessible spaces** for dialogue, skill-sharing & action
- Supporting **innovative youth-driven ideas** that advance social cohesion

# Proposed Local Initiatives - Women Focus

## Women Empowerment & Women-Led Initiatives

*(not limited to the following examples)*

- Increase women's participation in **social & economic life**, including women with disabilities
- **Skills-based workshops**: digital literacy, leadership, life skills
- **Safe, inclusive spaces** for dialogue, peer learning & shared action
- **Dialogue & advocacy with local authorities** to address community needs
- **Awareness & inclusive practices** on gender equality, disability rights & non-discrimination
- Support for **women-led innovative solutions** that strengthen social cohesion



## Implementation Strategies

To ensure effective and conflict-sensitive implementation, the following **strategies** will guide local initiatives:

- **Community Needs Assessment:** Identify priority needs, gaps, and target groups.
- **Planning & Feasibility:** Set realistic targets and avoid operational burden.
- **Capacity Building:** Provide training and tools for NGO design, delivery, and monitoring of local initiatives.
- **Partnerships:** Collaborate with councils, community leaders, unions, and local actors.
- **Inclusion & Participation:** Ensure meaningful engagement of women, youth, and PwDs.
- **Do-No-Harm & Conflict Sensitivity:** Avoid exacerbating tensions or creating negative impacts.
- **Monitoring & Learning:** Use simple tools to track progress and capture lessons learned.

# Implementation Mechanism & Roles under TAKAMUL III

---

**Primary Implementer:** The **co-applicant in Syria** leads implementation, field coordination, documentation, and reporting of Local Initiatives (LIs).

---

**Main Applicant Role:** Provides **oversight, compliance, and quality assurance**; does **not** implement activities directly.

---

**Community-Based Approach:** LIs are implemented in cooperation with **voluntary and community groups**, supporting outreach, facilitation, and community engagement.

---

**Legal Coordination:** Implementation is conducted in coordination with **relevant local authorities**, with all required legal approvals obtained prior to activities

# Duration, Financial & Compliance Framework

## **Duration of Local Initiatives**

Implementation period: **2 to 8 weeks**,  
Includes all preparatory and execution  
activities

## **Financial & Procedural Framework**

- Budget per initiative: **up to 3,000 EUR**
- Supports **small-scale**, community-driven activities
- **Main applicant**, in coordination with the co-applicant, leads financial management, documentation, and final reporting to GIZ.
- All implementation and financial documentation must comply with the **main applicant's policies** and be reviewed prior to submission to **GIZ**.

# Expected Outcomes & Sustainability

## Expected Outcomes

- Strengthened social cohesion and increased **community trust**
- Improved **capacities** of women, youth, and vulnerable groups
- Increased **community participation and ownership** in identifying and addressing local needs
- Enhanced **institutional capacity** of local NGOs
- **Improved access to social services** through sustained engagement and advocacy with local authorities

## Sustainability Measures

- Build **NGOs capacity** to manage and replicate activities independently
- Ensure **community ownership** from planning to implementation
- Use **local resources** (centers, schools, volunteers) to reduce costs and support continuity
